**Last Week: Kate Domenev** from Hobart Rotary Club talked of the **Windeward Bound** Community Project led by Sarah Parry.

The Windeward Bound Trust's Annual Youth Leadership Challenge is a working partnership with Rotary in Tasmania that also receives support from the Migrant Resource Centre of Southern Tasmania. This program promotes understanding, inclusiveness, and community by bringing together 20 young people of vastly different backgrounds for a ten-day voyage, and giving them the opportunity to connect and grow with one another in both the short and long term.

The construction of the ship began in 1992, and she was launched in 1996. Timber was used from several old Hobart ferries and also from the Elizabeth Street Pier wharf shed. Some of the rigging came from the Young Endeavour, which was the inspiration for this ship. She was built by volunteers who were tradies, street kids and young offenders. At times there were magistrates and the police commissioner helping on the building, which caused some tension among the youths, but they learnt to talk to all levels of the community through this project.

The Youth Leadership Challenge is open to youths between the ages of 15 - 18 living in Tasmania -- ten locals with an interest in mentoring and creating a more inclusive Tasmanian community, and ten from refugee backgrounds who recently settled in Tasmania.
